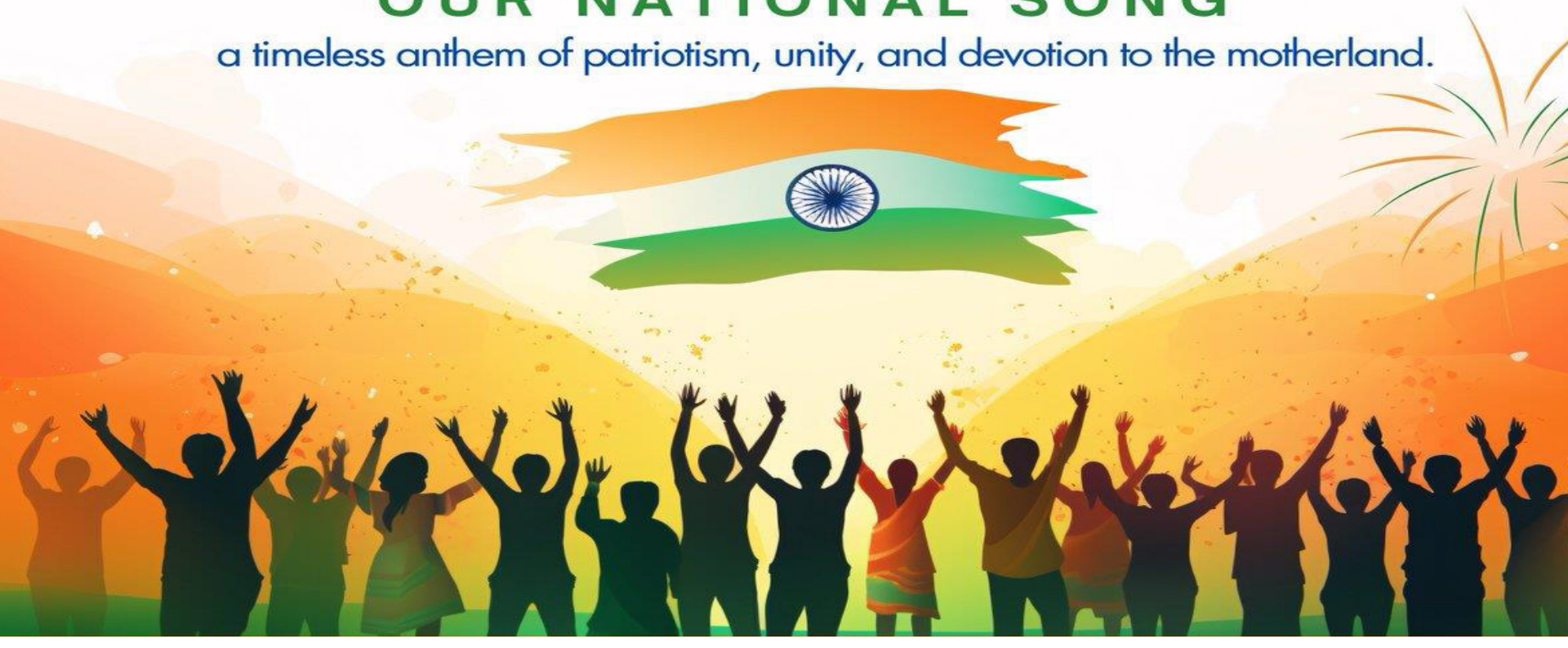





National Song Of India

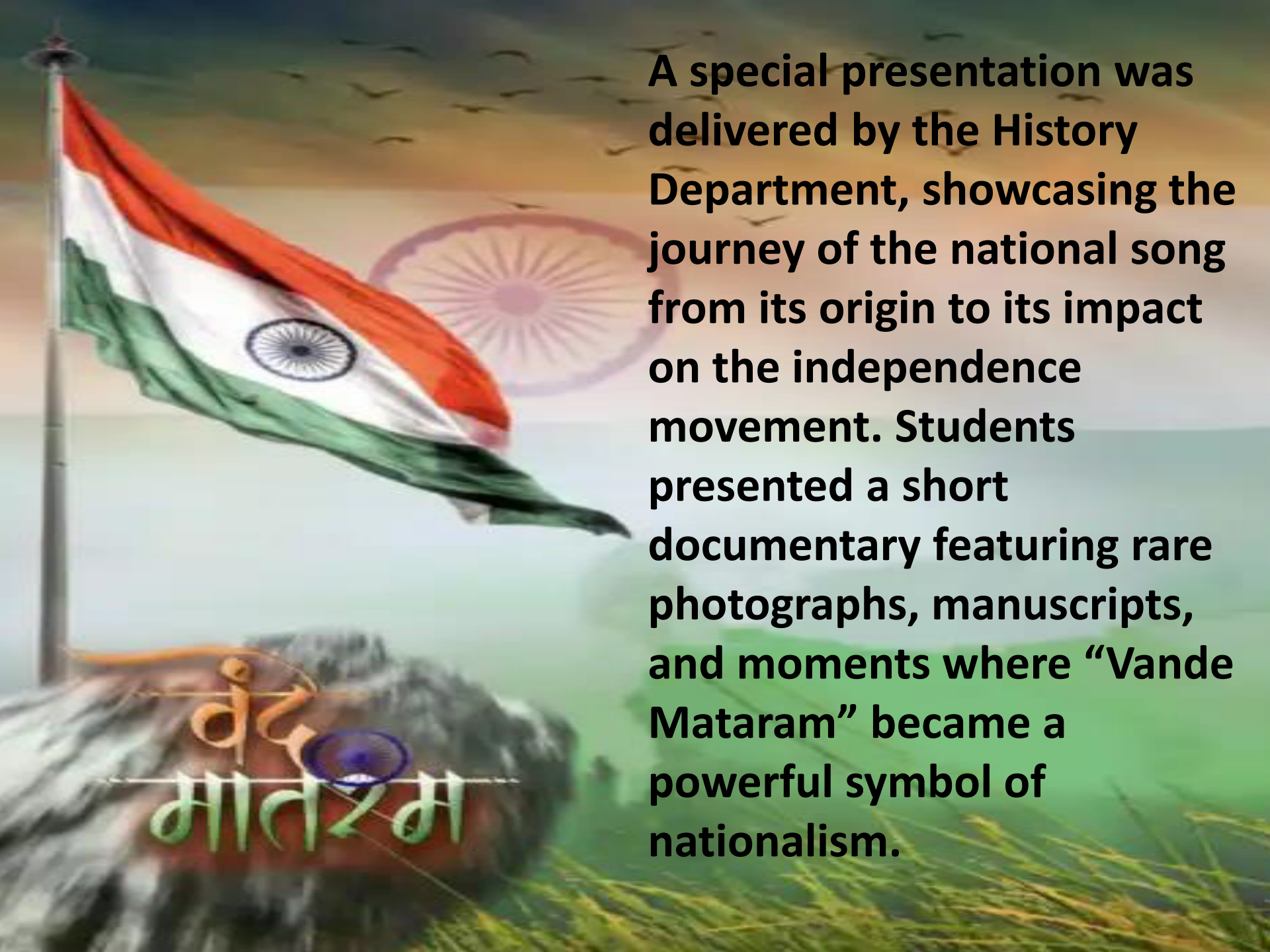

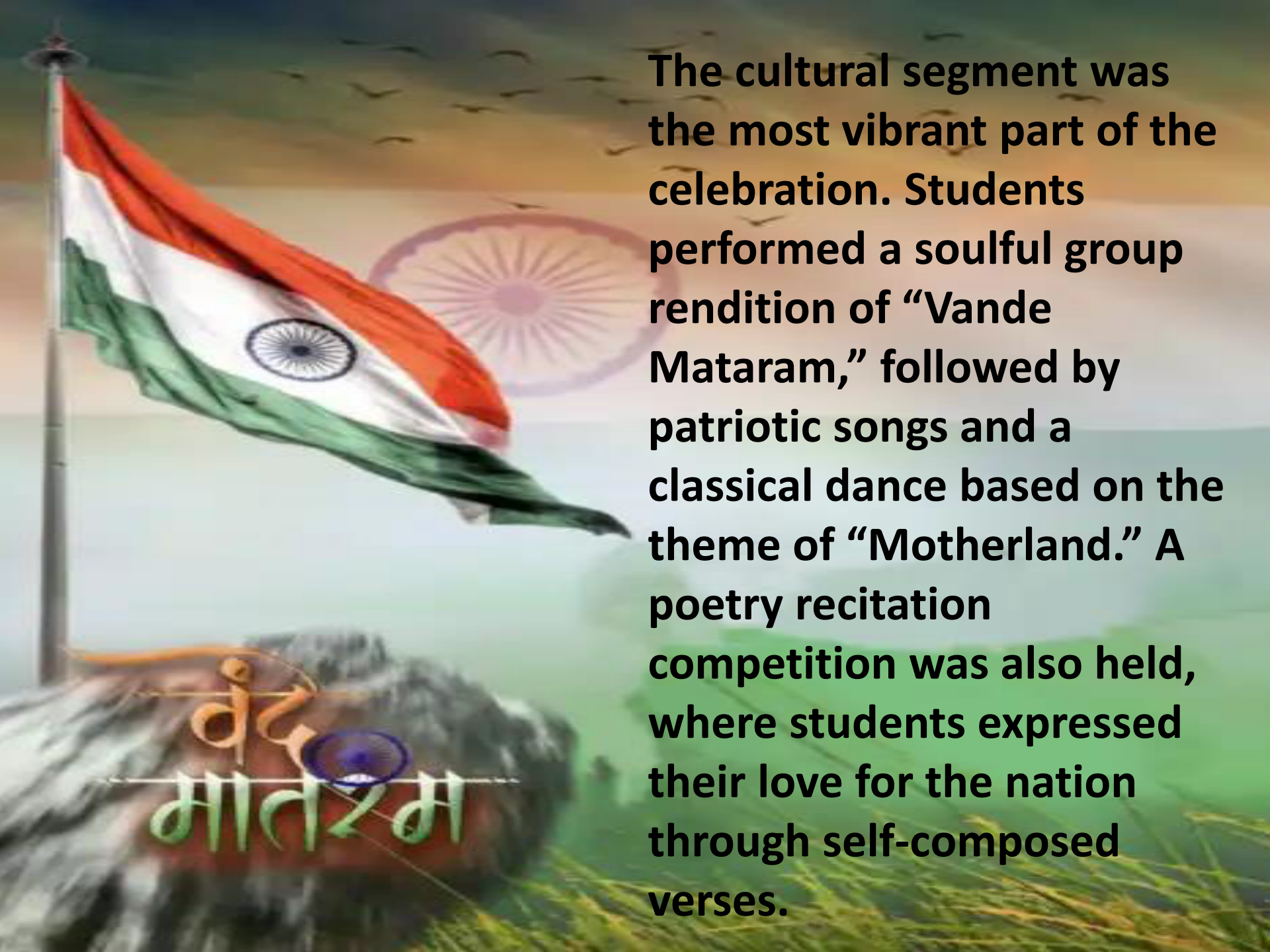


